TOWN OF FRYEBURG POSTED ROADS

EFFECTIVE MARCH 2, 2020

HEAVY LOADS LIMITED

All public roads in Fryeburg are posted to all vehicles registered for a gross weight of 23,000 lbs. or more beginning March 2, 2020 and continue until April 15, 2020 dependent upon the weather. All heavy vehicles are required to attain a permit to operate on a posted road in Fryeburg regardless of temperature. Regular delivery route trucks are exempt (Oil trucks, Propane Gas Trucks, Trash Haulers, Municipal Vehicles and other necessary vehicles).

Town of Fryeburg Posted Road Permit Guidelines/Supplement to the Ordinance Restricting Vehicles Weights on Posted Ways

Purpose:

In order to prevent damage, each spring many Town roads are posted, limiting heavy loads from traveling along specified Town roads. Dependent on weather/road conditions, or extenuating situations, permits may be issued allowing heavy vehicles to travel along these roads in compliance with the Town of Fryeburg Ordinance Restricting Vehicle Weights on Posted Ways. In order to obtain a permit to operate a heavy vehicle on a posted town way, a permit process has been established which is detailed below.

Guidelines:

All heavy vehicles are required to attain a permit to operate on a posted road in Fryeburg regardless of temperature. In order to receive a Posted Road Permit, applicants must first complete an Application For Permit To Operate On a Posted Way. These applications are available at the Department of Public Works and at the Town Office during regular business hours or at www.fryeburgmaine.org. Completed forms must be submitted to the Public Works Superintendent, or designee, for approval.

Permits will be issued at the discretion of the Public Works Director based on forecasted weather conditions, temperatures, and road conditions or the specific extenuating circumstances. The issuance of a permit may be denied if the Public Works Director determines the proposed use could reasonably harm or cause damage to the town way.

The Town of Fryeburg reserves the right to rescind permits due to changes in weather and road conditions.

Permittee Responsibilities/Damage:

If the Public Works Director has evidence that the permittee has caused damage to the roads, the permittee will be responsible for providing the full cost to repair the damage. No future permits will be issued until this damage is fully repaired.
